Required	In solicitations and contracts that include the simplified acquisition threshold, the FAR requires the contractor to provide a copy of the FAR to the contractor's personnel who are responsible for the contract. The FAR is a guide to the contractor's obligations and is a key document for the contractor's compliance with the FAR.

7. View reporting requirements and link directly to the associated forms.
8. View any associated subcontract flowdown requirements.
9. Link to the full text of relevant agency supplements, Federal Acquisition Circular Amendments, and archived clauses and provisions to provide a historical framework.
10. View clear information for the inclusion of clauses by contract type and/or deliverable.
11. Save, print, email, or export your chart quickly and easily.

The Contractor must comply with agency personal identity verification procedures identified in the contract that implement Homeland Security Presidential Directive-12 (HSPD-12), Office of Management and Budget guidance M-05-24, and Federal Information Processing Standards Publication (FIPS PUB) Number 201. Clause covers Contractor and subcontractor personnel who require routine physical access to a federally-controlled facility or information system. Contractors must account for all Government-provided identification issued to employees under a contract, i.e., the PIV cards or other similar badges, and return the identification to the issuing agency when it is no longer needed or required.
